

Pozivni simpozijum: Kako je biti LGBT osoba? Šta kaže nauka.

U toku svog života, čovek se uključuje u veliki broj bliskih relacija. Ove relacije, ne samo da zadovoljavaju osnovnu potrebu čoveka kao socijalnog bića, već doprinose zdravlju i opštem blagostanju osobe. Od svih relacija, u odraslom dobu, posebno se izdvajaju intimne partnerske relacije čija je osnovna svrha zadovoljenje potreba pojedinca za pripadnošću, zajedništvom, intimnošću, bliskošću, zaštitom, podrškom itd. Radovi okupljeni u ovom simpozijumu predstavljaju rezultate nekoliko istraživanja koja su se bavila LGBT partnerskim relacijama. Ideja simpozijuma je da opiše kvalitet života LGBT osoba kroz individualne, relacione, porodične i društvene pokazatelje. Biće ispitani prediktori i procesi koji doprinose zadovoljstvu u partnerskim relacijama. Kroz različite radove biće predstavljen kontekst u kojem se homoseksualne relacije u Srbiji i regionu stvaraju i razvijaju, te socijalni i lični izazovi i zahtevi za prilagođavanjem sa kojima se mogu suočiti LGBT osobe i njihove porodice.

Invited symposium: What's It Like To Be LGBT?: What the Science Have to Say

Throughout a lifetime, people are involved in many close relationships. These relationships not only represent the basic human need but also contribute to their health and general well-being. Out of all relations, in adulthood, the most important are intimate partner relationships, whose primary purpose is to satisfy individual needs for belonging, togetherness, intimacy, support and protection. Data gathered in this symposium are the results of several studies that have addressed LGBT people. The idea of the symposium is to describe life quality of LGBT people through individual, relational, family and social indicators. Predictors and processes that contribute to partner satisfaction will be examined. Throughout the research, the context of homosexual relations in Serbia and the region will be presented in terms of how are those relations created and developed and as well as what are the social, personal challenges and demands for adjustment that LGBT people and their families may face.
